Igor Stravinsky's iconic work, L'Histoire du Soldat (The Soldier's Tale), is based on the age-old story of a young man who sells his soul to the devil, achieving fame and fortune, but ultimately losing everything when the devil calls in the debt. Wynton Marsalis's A Fiddler's Tale retains the structure of Stravinsky's scenario, but updates the action to the present, creating a parable involving the devil, corruption, and the concept of shame.
